- 447 Recycling: Item in the newsletter asking if people were finding it difficult to dispose of their glass. Subject to response, a glass collection could be organised.

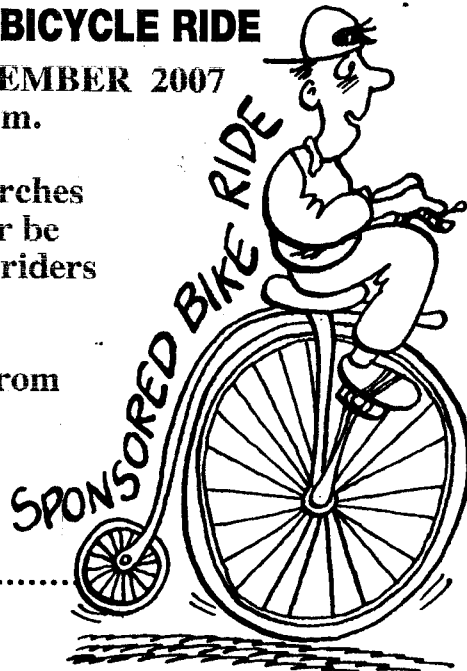
There being no further business the Chairman closed the meeting at 8.50 p.m.

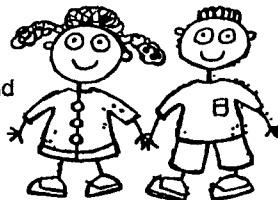

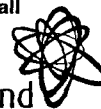

## **Play-time at the new Tostock Play Area is getting closer!**

Nearly £30'000 in funds have now been secured for the re-design of the Tostock play area. This is thanks to significant progress with our key funding applications; Mid Suffolk District Council, the Local Network Fund and Suffolk County Council have all recently confirmed that our applications were successful. Our final application is with the BIFFA Award, who have agreed that our project falls within their funding remit, so fingers crossed that they this will also have a positive outcome.

Local fundraising also received a tremendous boost thanks to a generous donation from a member of our community – thank you again! Recent fundraising events such as the car treasure hunt run from the Gardeners Arms and the village dance were also well supported and have helped us progress towards our target of raising 10% of the total project spend.

Three companies have now tendered for the installation and provision of the new playground equipment and their detailed plans have been displayed at recent village events. The next steps therefore involve finalising which company will provide the equipment and agreeing on the design/content of the new play area.

With this significant progress, the project group is hopeful that the new play area may be up and running before the end of this year!

## WHAT IS NEIGHBOURHOOD WATCH?

Neighbourhood Watch is not just about reducing burglary figures – it's about creating communities who care. It brings local people together and can make a real contribution to improving their lives. The activity of Watch members can foster a new community spirit and a belief in the community's ability to tackle problems. At the same time, you feel secure, knowing your neighbours are keeping an eye on your property.

There are other benefits to Neighbourhood Watch schemes too. You will become familiar with crime prevention ideas which will help keep your home and belongings safe. And the extra security which belonging to a Neighbourhood Watch scheme offers might even mean that you can get a premium discount from your insurance company.

## How schemes work

Neighbourhood Watch schemes can be large, covering, for example most of the households on an estate or they might involve just half a dozen houses. It depends on the area and what people living there want.

A scheme is generally led by a volunteer co-ordinator whose job is to get people working together and make sure things get done. As well as the co-ordinator, there is usually a committee. Committees meet regularly to plan which problems to target and what action to take. Schemes keep in close touch with local police to share information and advice.

Church Road and New Road areas still do not have a co-ordinator so are at a disadvantage. Fortunately Tostock has a very low crime rate which we hope to maintain. A co-ordinator is urgently needed for these two areas. If you would like more information please contact the village co-ordinator Jon Walker, 271609 who will be pleased to give you more details.
