MINUTES OF MEETING 23.04.08

The minutes of the Parish Council Meeting were approved as a true and accurate record and signed accordingly.

Councillors also noted that the March minutes were amended to reflect the comments made under Public Forum.

MATTERS ARISING

- 151 Road Ruts, Old Tostock Hall: No further information at present in respect of the pot holes. Clerk to chase. Highways to be approached in respect of the high volume of lorries travelling through the village up to the Fox & Goose, Church Road and The Leys and to ascertain the agreed route for Rookery Farm.
- 365 Tree on The Green: The meeting agreed to continue monitoring the situation.
- 386 Footpath behind Perkins Way: The Rights of Way officer to be contacted in respect of a similar problem of erosion happening to the path further. The Tostock path sign needed to be re-erected and repair of a stile discussed. Cllr Burman agreed to deal with the path sign.
- 506 Proud Manhole cover on the Green: Highways to be provided with more information in respect of the exact problem of the covers.

COUNTRYSIDE STEWARDSHIP

Based on information which had appeared in a newspaper article – copy to be brought to the next meeting - Cllr Burman felt the council should continue to manage The Leys as it has been but not necessarily carry on with the Countryside Stewardship scheme which was due to expire in September 2009. Following a short discussion, Councillors also agreed that the Clerk should invite Mr C Buckle to the next meeting to discuss the way forward since he had managed The Leys up until last year on behalf of the parish council.

Mr P Murrell had applied to cut, bale and remove grass on The Leys and councillors were in agreement for this to be done at the appropriate time i.e. not before 15th July.

It was pointed out that a ditch near the pond area was blocked – cnr Perkins Way near Pine Acre – and a drain cover in Norton Road had lifted with the additional water.

It was also pointed out that the grassed area in front of The Barns had been cut – presumably by the owners -which was contrary to Stewardship agreement. This section should be allowed to revert to its original natural state.

TOSTOCK WEBSITE

The meeting agreed that an item should be placed in The Chronicle asking for a volunteer to update and generally manage the site. Chairman to arrange and provide a suitable article.

AFFORDABLE HOUSING SURVEY (Item 434)

No further information at present. Currently waiting to hear whether or not the sites identified were feasible for development and it was viable to proceed.

RABBIT INFESTATION

As many residents are aware there is an infestation of rabbits on the village green and the gardens of the surrounding properties. The rabbits have been identified as mainly coming from the Meadow House site and the field behind Croft Cottage known as the Tyre Field. It is a legal obligation of land owners to control rabbits on their property PESTS ACT 1954 if they are causing problems on neighbouring land and/or gardens.

Some residents have already written to the respective land agents and it is understood that the P.C. and V.H.M.C. will also be writing. If you are one of the residents affected and have not yet written please contact the Old Post Office for a copy of form WML-G02 (04/07) and details of the procedure and addresses of the agents. The cost of the extermination has to be covered by the land owners and will cost residents nothing

Tostock Village Association

The TVA would like to thank everyone who helped with, and supported the fund raising BBQ on 21st June held in the grounds of the Gardeners Arms by kind permission of Stan and Jackie.

The inclement weather did not dampen the enthusiasm of those attending and many combined this with a visit to the Art Show at the Church.

The sum of £450. was raised and together with some generous donations the event raised in the region of £1,000.

At 6.30pm on Friday 4th July Tostock village hall was packed to capacity with many standing at the back. There were also in excess of 30 apologies, to attend a Public Meeting convened and chaired by David Ruffley M.P. in order to discuss the many serious issues and failures of both the Mid Suffolk District Councils planning department and the Suffolk County Councils highways department and their lack of response to letters from the TVA, their lawyers and residents of the village.

Andrea Hill Chief Executive Officer for SCC and Alan Newman Chief Highways Officer SCC, Andrew Good Chief Executive Officer MSDC, Phillip Isbell Professional Lead Officer Planning MSDC and Peter Goodyear Senior Planning Officer MSDC were all invited to attend but all declined with what Mr. Ruffley described as pathetic excuses. Mr. Ruffley praised the residents of Tostock for forming the TVA and for the tireless efforts of the committee to redress these planning problems.

Planning policies are inconsistent and not accurate and comments and observations made to these authorities on planning issues have been totally ignored or downgraded.

The Highways department are also inconsistent with their judgments

Environmental issues have not been properly investigated.

Misleading and inaccurate information is given to the planning committee by the senior officers.

The TVA has asked for disciplinary procedures to enable action to be taken against these planning officers but this request has so far been ignored.

The site at Norton Road had not been pegged out as promised by the planning officer and no proper measurements taken. Mr. Isbell marked the area by measuring with his feet at the site meeting.

Mr. Ruffley again stated that 'ALL OFFICERS ARE PAID SERVANTS OF THE PUBLIC AND THEREFORE SHOULD BE ACCOUNTABLE FOR THEIR ACTIONS'.

There were also representatives from Drinkstone and Thurston who voiced their concerns with regard to the planning department, their lack of response and inappropriate manner in which planning applications were dealt with.

Mr. Ruffley stated that some concerned residents of Tostock had generously donated their own money to cover the considerable legal fees.

He again thanked the committee of the TVA for their unstinting efforts and pledged that he would not rest until he was able to get satisfactory results.

He then brought the meeting to a close and was thanked by Mr. A. Henderson for arranging this meeting and for his interest and help he was prepared to undertake on our behalf.

At the end of the meeting refreshments were available and the evening ended at approximately 9-0pm

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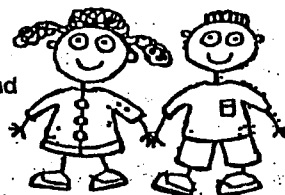
