ANNUAL PARISH MEETING

Twelve residents and three parish councillors attended the A.P.M. on 29th April. Also present were Cty.Cllr. Jane Storey and Dist.Cllr.Carol; Milward. Four apologies were received.

In the absence of both the Chairman and Vice Chairman the meeting was conducted by Cllr.Maureen Beales.

Minutes of the 2008 A.P.M. were circulated and accepted.

The County and District Councillors both gave their reports and responded to questions raised by members at the meeting. These included the overgrown roadside hedge at the south eastern side of New Road, the ongoing problems with the ditch opposite the bus shelter, the wrongly erected, re-designed footpath notice from Church Road to the allotments and the uncompleted electricity works in Leys Road despite the road being closed for four weeks. All of these matters would be investigated by the councillors.

Reports were also received from the Suffolk Constabulary, V.H.M.C., Tennis Club, Brownies and the Chairman, but none were read out. Reports submitted at the meeting were from the Gardening Club, Past and Present Society and Tostocks recorder for the Suffolk Local History Council (for file only) and the Poores Estate Charity. This showed an opening balance of £680.17. Income from share dividends and allotment rents £356.22. Seven parishioners received £40. each at Christmas leaving a closing balance of £756.39. The share values decreased by £254.32 during the year. Allotment rents had been increased to £10. per plot or £5. for half a plot. The committee was now at full strength.

The unaudited Parish Council balance sheet was circulated showing an opening balance of £52,014.57. An income of £8569.31 with expenditure of £17,314.95. leaving a closing balance of £43,268.93.

VILLAGE OF THE YEAR 2009 competition. As the Parish council were not very keen to enter this competition Mike O'Reilly pointed out that in view of Tostocks past successes with the Best Kept Village awards that we should enter especially as this was the last time a competition was to be held in its present format. In previous years there had been a great community spirit and that he would undertake to organise helpers again and to hopefully enlist at least some members of the council and younger people.

Various questions were asked from the floor. These included the fact that there was much mis-information on the Tostock Website. The questioner was informed that this was now in the process of being up-dated.

Considerable feeling was expressed regarding the clutter and number of outdated notices on the Parish notice board and the fact that no-one knew who the keyholder was and some village organisations were unable to display their meetings and events.

Much concern was also expressed regarding the lateness of the Parish Council minutes in the Chronicle. Various suggestions were put forward to improve this and the P.C. agreed to look into these matters at the next meeting.

There was a general feeling of disgust that although Tostock had nine Councillors only three could bother to attend the annual meeting.

Cllr. Beales was praised for the way she conducted the meeting which she brought to a close at 9.10 pm

However, Peter Southrill had been invited to talk on the possibility of a club for the young people of this village so delivered his proposals which were accepted in principle.

Matt McCleary was also present at the meeting to explain the progress in up-dating the Tostock Website. This was approved, but more work is to be done and is in hand.

Following the comments at the A.P.M. regarding the publication of the minutes in the Chronicle it has been suggested that the old system of publishing a precis of the meeting be printed and the complete minutes displayed on the parish notice board for anyone to read once they had been ratified.

The re-arranged A.P.C.M. was held on 27th May and attended by five parish councillors. There were three apologies; and Steve Walker tendered his resignation with immediate effect. Three residents also were in attendance.

ELECTION OF OFFICERS Due to the fact that no-one was willing to undertake the role of Chairman or Vice-Chairman it was agreed to appoint a chairman at each council meeting on a rotation basis.

Cllr. Malcom took the chair for this meeting.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved and signed.

The proposed Youth Group which it is hoped to start in October was discussed as was the updating of the Website.

Six cheques were requested for signatures and two cheques had been received.

Notices have been received for Leys Road closure in June.

The council will be writing to the Highways requesting that the Long Leys road be re-instated after the damage caused by the previous traffic diversions.

A.O.B. The problem of rabbit infestation was discussed and also some self help in the resurfacing of the Village Hall car park. It is hoped to encourage a community spirit and get some of the younger residents involved with village affairs.

It was also suggested to explore the possibilities of cutting road side hedges in New Road, Church Road and Norton Road.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9-30 pm.

The balance sheet had been circulated. This showed a surplus of £654.83. Matthew Burman proposed that this was accepted and seconded by Roshdy Guirgis. All present were in favour.

It is understood that this is the last year that the competition will be held in this format and the feeling was that it is even more important that Tostock should enter. Mike O'Reilly agreed to co-ordinate working parties and would hopefully also enlist assistance from the Parish Council.

There being no further business the chairman thanked everyone for their attendance and the meeting closed at 8-30pm.

RABBIT INFESTATION

Last year many residents on the Green and in Flatts Lane were infested with rabbits in their gardens causing much damage to vegetation and flowers. It appears that the problem is rearing its head again and complaints are being received.

It is a legal obligation for the land owner to control rabbits which damage neighbouring properties - Pests Act 1954.

Residents are urged to write to the land owner requesting action, but if this fails contact Natural England who can then issue an enforcement notice.

A copy of the law and addresses can be obtained from the Old Post Office (270278)

Natural England is a free service and will only cost you the price of a stamp.

The more residents who write the better and hopefully this action will save your gardens.

WENT Community First Responders

We are pleased to be able to report that Tostock at last has a Responder based in the village.

Karen has joined a small team of responders that cover Woolpit, Elmswell, Norton and Tostock. We also cover the villages from Stowlangtoft to Great Ashfield.

We would like to thank the villagers of Tostock for their donation which helped us start up the group. The money was used to purchase equipment such as Defibrillator and other necessary items.

We are a purely voluntary organisation and receive no financial support. Through donations we have managed to set up kit for the four main villages.

We are trained by the Ambulance Service and we receive further instruction on a monthly basis at our regular meetings.

Once a 999 call has been made if it falls into the category of a Heart Attack, Stroke, Diabetic Coma, Breathing difficulties, etc we will be called by the Ambulance Service to Respond. Living locally we try to be first on scene to deal with the incident until the Ambulance arrives. This could make a difference in terms of the survival of the patient. Although we all have Sat Nav, the main problem we have is finding properties especially in the dark, so can we appeal to everyone to make sure we can see their house name or number from the road.

We do not go to Road traffic Accidents, where Alcohol is involved or to children under eight. We always have the choice to say no.

We are only a very small team and we try hard to cover 24 hours a day seven day a week. Sadly we sometimes do not have enough people to cover all of this period.

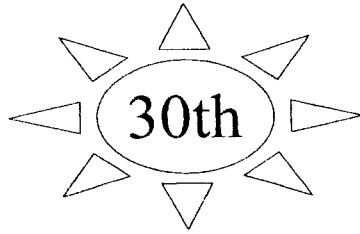
CORE SERVICES DIRECT

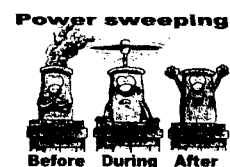

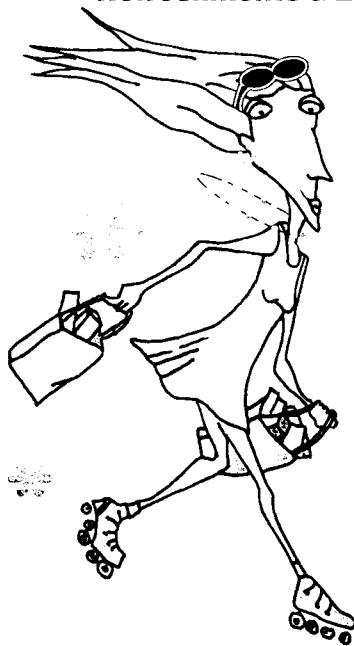

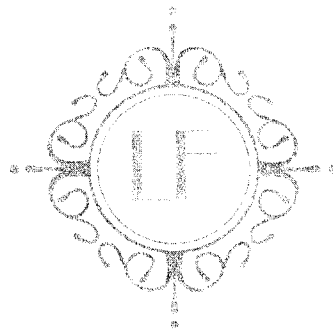
