## Parish Council

A meeting was held on 24th February chaired by Cllr.M.Burman. Clerk Mrs.M.Bottomley. Present Cllrs. M.Beales, D.Plester, P.Parsons, S.Waitkins, E.Wadsworth, and W.Moore.

Apologues Cllrs.D.Harman and V.Malcom also Dist.Cllr.C.Milward. Seventeen parishioners and P.C.Swain were also in attendance.

**PUBLIC FORUM** Val Kemball spoke regarding the proposal to place picnic tables and benches on the village green. She had received 9 E mails and 19 letters protesting about this proposal. Various comments included 'it would be 'an extension to the pub' 'this is a special open space which would be spoilt' 'It is the centre of a conservation area' 'Noise and disruption to residents on the Green' ' More litter and rubbish' 'Would spoil the peace and tranquility of the village and spoil the vista' plus many more comments.

All the visitors fully supported these remarks and added further objections. This matter was discussed later in the meeting and finally Cllr.Burman proposed that no further action should be taken and all street furniture remain as at present. This was seconded by Cllr.P.Parsons. It was noted that all street furniture should be inspected and repaired as necessary and this would include the 'Walters seat' at the village hall which had been donated by their daughter in 1984 on the understanding that it would be maintained in good condition by the Parish Council.

P.C.Swain reported five crimes to the 21st February which included the theft of sleepers from the village hall car park, car wheel nuts and hub cap, theft of chickens and coop from premises in Church Road. He also stated that scrap metal theft is again on the increase and all residents are urged to be extra vigilant.

Dist Cllr. C.Milward had confirmed with the clerk that the council tax for this year would be 2.4%

There was no report from the Cty.Cllr.

The Website is now progressing but further details and information is being sought. Cllr.Waitkins suggested a sub-committee to deal with this and that she would be willing to organise All agreed.

The Church has requested permission to hold a fete on the village green over the weekend of 17/18th July. All village organisations would be participating and monies received would be shared between the organisation and the Church. This was agreed. The proposed fete to be run by the parish council on 24th July in connection with the 2012 olympics would not now take place but combined with the church

**DOGGIE BINS** Cllr.Waitkins presented good reasons for providing Doggie bins and was also speaking on behalf of many parishioners. She proposed that the parish council should provide three bins, but as no one was prepared to second this proposal the council would not be taking any further action.

**REPLACEMENT PHOTOCOPIER** As Cllr.Harman was not present it was agreed to leave this item for discussion at the next meeting.

**RISK ASSESSMENT** Still ongoing.  
Five cheques were presented for signature and agreed. Monies had also been received for advertising in the Chronicle.

S.A.L.C. It was agreed to arrange an 'in house' training session for councillors to learn their duty requirements.

**VILLAGE GREEN** Complaints have been received about the disgraceful state of the village green especially the central area due to cars and other vehicles. Also complaints about horses being ridden on the Green, the Leys and on some footpaths. A special note is to be placed in the Chronicle. The damage caused by a lorry to the triangle at the northern end of the Leys was witnessed and photographs taken, and the firm responsible informed. Estimates are to be obtained for the repair of this area.

# Tostock Village Association

24 residents attended the A.G.M chaired by Mark Jull. There were also 14 apologies

The circulated report of the 2009 A.G.M. were approved and signed

The chairman outlined the work done by the association during the past year on behalf of the village with special emphasis on the proposed Meadow House site development and the building in Norton Road.

A resident from Norton Road spoke about his frustrations and problems with the various officers at the Mid Suffolk District Council regarding a dispute regarding boundary measurements. There seems to be a total lack of communication between the departments which highlights still further the problems experienced by the TVA. The association will take up this matter immediately. It was for these reasons that the TVA was formed and why members paid £7,000 out of their own pockets to get professional advice from a leading Planning Solicitor in London. They have confirmed that many of the actions of the MSDC are incorrect. The MSDC have agreed that the TVA were right to question various actions and have admitted their errors BUT are slow to answer letters written by the TVA or their Solicitor.

The membership secretary reported there are now 51 households with registered members

The treasurer circulated the balance sheet which showed a balance in hand of £650.67. Its proposal was proposed by Jane Sherwood and seconded by Mark Jull. All in favour.

There has been one resignation from the committee and Jane Sherwood was proposed to fill the vacancy. There were no objections to this and all the officers were elected to serve for another year.

Much concern was expressed from the floor regarding the very bad state of the village green, and it was felt that it was being cut too frequently.

It was emphasised that the TVA is a flexible group with a view to getting residents involved for the good of the village and its life and in no way had any personal intent. The association was not in opposition to the Parish Council but had hoped the two bodies could work together for the good of the community.

It was urged for residents to talk to Parish Councillors more on their views and concerns regarding village matters so that the feelings of the majority could be taken into account.

There being no further business the meeting closed at 9-00pm

Light refreshments were then served.

### **Friends of the Woolpit Health Centre**

The Trustees thank all those who have sent in donations during the past year – from individuals or groups, or in memory of a friend or relative who has died. Every amount, whether it is large or small, is very much appreciated and used for the benefit of the patients who attend the Woolpit Health Centre.

The main items purchased during last year have been an interpretative ECG machine for £1589 which is used for diagnosing heart complaints and an additional 24 hour ECG monitor costing £1005. This is additional to the two already in use, saving patients having to wait to be assessed. Other purchases have been a trolley for the leg ulcer clinic costing £513 and an ear syringe device for £247 replacing the one originally bought by the Friends in 1998. Over £3000 was spent on maintenance items to keep all the existing equipment in good order.

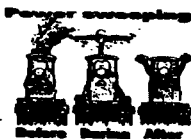

On the 29th January 2010, a new village tree, to replace the magnificent Horse Chestnut that we sadly lost due to disease and which stood so majestically as a symbol of Tostock, was delivered to us.

The tree was supplied by Barcham Trees near Ely, Cambridgeshire. Barchams are specialists in containerised trees and stock 125,000 trees over their 300-acre site.

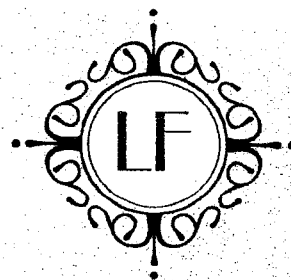
To stop the risk on any future contamination, we needed to choose a different variety.

The replacement tree is already about 22 feet tall and probably some 25 years old.

Our new village tree is a PIN OAK (QUERCUS PALUSTRIS) and at autumn time, the leaves will turn from green to crimson. It should be a truly wonderful stand-alone tree on the village green and will hopefully give immense pleasure to us all for many decades to come.

Keep an eye on it and just watch it mature to its full potential.


