Season's Greetings to You All

December-January 2010/11



Parish Council

A meeting was held on the 6th of October, chaired by Cllr. S. Waitkins. Present were : cllrs. M. Beales, D. Plester, W. Moore and E. Wadsworth.

Apologies from Cllrs D. Harman, M. Burman, and V. Malcolm.

Clerk Mrs. M. Bottomley.

Also present Cllr., Jane Storey and Dist. Cllr. Carol Milward.

12 Parishioners were also in attendance.

At the Public Forum Barney Harrison informed the meeting that due to the high cost of an authorised Leader the group formed last year has now been put on 'hold'. He thanked the Parish Council for their earlier interest and financial support.

The V.H.M.C. reported that the Suffolk County Council had agreed in principle to offer financial assistance towards cavity wall insulation for the village hall. It was hoped to have this installed before the winter. Also a request was made for a directional sign to the village hall to be installed on the roads into the village. There were also concerns regarding vandalism at the hall and damage to the car park. Speeding vehicles in Norton Road was also a problem which should be looked into but it was felt that this should be a matter for the police.

P.A. 2601/10 Mr. G. Cox spoke of his own and his neighbours concerns about the amended plans for the replacement of the Bunglings. This was to be discussed later in the meeting.

The meeting proper then commenced and after a small amendment the minutes of the previous meeting were approved for signature.

Before the meeting Cllr. Waitkins had visited the proposed new dwelling at Bunglings and had taken photographs on which she had superimposed measurements. There were many inaccuracies and misinformation in the application and at least seven major faults identified. All councillors agreed with these findings and the planning department to be notified accordingly and that the application should be rejected. The legal section of the S.C.C. had confirmed that the Commons Registration Act 1968 clearly states the Village Green and The Leys were placed under the ownership of the Parish Council. The address on the application was given as Leys Road. This is incorrect and in fact should be the Leys and could possibly involve an easement fee.

Cllr. Jane Storey spoke on the New Strategic Direction of the council and the possible involvement of the various parishes to help in various ways such as running a library and other organisations at present run by the council. The Council budget has been cut by 23/30% so this is maybe the way forward to making savings.

Dist.Cllr. Carol Milward also spoke along similar lines with the district budget being cut by a similar amount. Mid Suffolk Council was to be merged with Baburgh District Council. She has spent many hours working on the Norton Road development problems and it is now understood that it will be placed in the hands of the Land Arbitrator. She also reminded the council that elections would take place in May 2011.

Suffolk Police had e-mailed their report and it was understood that a car parked outside the Croft Bungalows had had an unsuccessful attempt at petrol theft.

Fireworks. Cllr. Burman was not present to give details of this event which had been fixed for the 6th of November and is expected to be held on The Leys.

WEBSITE. Cllr. Waitkins reported that the Tostock Website is now up and running and thanked Richard Conway for his valued assistance.

FOOTWAY extension from Highmoor House to Perkins Way. Cllrs Beales and Wadsworth are to meet with Peter Goodyear of the Highways department for a site meeting. Clerk to arrange as soon as possible.

Fly tipping has been reported in The Drift and in Hollow Lane. Clerk to contact Core Services to investigate.

Various matters on the agenda had to be deferred until the next meeting as the councillors responsible for these items were not present.

Also for the November meeting is the outcome of the Rookery Farm and proposed payment of costs. Eight cheques were approved for signature.

Parish Council

A meeting was held on the 10th November, chaired by Cllr. S. Waitkins. Present were : cllrs. M.Beales, D. Plester, W. Moore, E. Wadsworth, V. Malcom and M. Burman
Clerk Mrs. M. Bottomley.

Also present Dist. Cllr. Steve Carlton Walker and five parishioners.

The Chairman announced that D. Harman and P. Parsons had tendered their resignations from the Council and thanked them for their past interest and involvement with council work.

Minutes of the previous meeting were approved for signature.

Both the County Councillor and Suffolk Police had e-mailed their reports.

The District Councillor confirmed that the Rookery Farm activities would cease and that the merger with Mid Suffolk and Baburgh District Councils were now in place.

Vandalism had taken place on the telephone kiosk and arrangements were to be made to replace seven panes of glass.

A report was given regarding the recent firework and bonfire night but further discussion would take place regarding next year's possible event.

Footpath in Norton Road – Following a meeting with a member of the SCC the cost of the footpath was in the region of £48,000. This could not be met by the P.C. and it was agreed to contact the housing Association who had purchased the recently erected bungalows to make a suitable contribution and also to contact nearby residents to ask if they needed the footpath.

Fly tipping – All rubbish has now been removed.

Planning Application 3123/10 – Rebuild part of the gable wall and repairs to roof etc. at the Coach House Leys Road had no objections.

The MSDC planning department held a committee meeting to discuss the proposed replacement property for the Bunglings, The Leys at which the Parish Council and nearby neighbours raised many objections (as reported in the earlier P.C. report). As a result a site meeting was to be held with all concerned parties. It was confirmed that Cllr. Waitkins should be the approved speaker on behalf of the Parish Council.

Land Registration- because various changes in rules took place in 2007 this village again has to re-register their ownership of The Green and the Leys. Parking should NOT be allowed on either of these sites. This was proposed and seconded by Cllr. Beales all six councillors agreed with one objecting.

Various cheques were approved for signature.

Benches on The Village Green. This matter had been discussed at an earlier meeting when it was agreed to wait until the new tree had grown before replacing a bench. However in view of a new request a site meeting will be held to discuss the suitability of a replacement and reports made at the next council meeting which will be held on 15th of December.

The TVA gave full support to the P.C. and nearby neighbours attending the recent site meeting to oppose the proposed replacement dwelling at The Bunglings on the Leys.

The MSDC Planning Committee and Conservation Officer were also in attendance.

The committee unanimously rejected the application as being inappropriate for a conservation area. The only person to support the application was the chief planning officer Mr. Philip Isbell.

As committee A was the one that approved the Meadow House site development stating that it would not have any impact on the village although it too was in a conservation area they were invited to visit the site whilst in the village to see for themselves what had taken place in Flatts Lanes.

Was it just the cold weather that caused the red faces!

It has also been noted that our concerns over the boundaries at Norton Road development have been vindicated and the matter is to go to arbitration.

We continue to pursue MSDC for a response to our complaints about the Planning Department.

David Ruffley M.P. has asked us to contact him and a further report will appear in the next Chronicle.

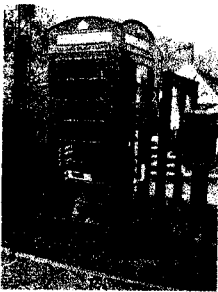
Car Parking on The Green and The Leys.

This is the second time it has happened; the bill will be about £80 – we need to put in strengthened glass so that the next time some idiot wants to 'head-butt' the glass they do not injure themselves!!!!

The other piece of mindless occupation is moving the grit boxes about the village. These are situated in strategic positions where grit will be needed for the roads to allow traffic to move about the village in relative safety. Whoever it is, remember, if the boxes are not in the position they have been assigned then the gritters will not fill them – so no grit for the roads.

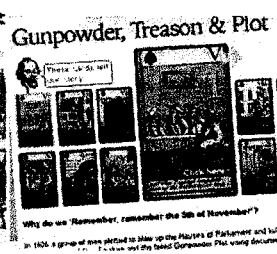

TOSTOCK BONFIRE NIGHT 2010 !



Tostock Guy Fawkes night was held on Saturday the 6th of November. It was a beautiful night with a clear, cloudless sky – ideal for a bonfire and fireworks. Everybody who came enjoyed themselves, there was a bar, a barbeque and a sparkler stall something for everyone!!!! The fireworks were as usual spectacular thanks to Angus, Matthew and the other pyrotechnics. We all enjoyed the noise, the colour and the laughter.



BUT!!!! How many of us knows the story behind Guy Fawkes Night? And who was he?

Guy Fawkes (1570 – 1606) was a Roman Catholic revolutionary who along with other revolutionaries planned the Gun Powder Plot. They objected to James I of England who would not follow the policy of toleration towards the Catholic population.

So the plot was hatched to kill the King and the Protestant Aristocracy by blowing up the Houses of Parliament in Westminster. Although Guy Fawkes executed the plot, Robert Gatesby was the brain behind the conspiracy. The plotters rented a cellar under the House of Lords. By March 1605, 36 barrels of gunpowder were hidden in the cellar. The conspirators did not want their fellow Catholics in parliament to be killed. One of them wrote to his friend Lord Monteagle about the plot. However the letter was discovered and the plot foiled !!

Guy Fawkes was caught red-handed as he tried to ignite the gunpowder. Fawkes was arrested and imprisoned. He was tortured but did not reveal the names of his fellow conspirators. The co-conspirators proudly proclaimed themselves after they had fled. Fawkes was found guilty and sentenced to death by hanging. However he did not like the ignominy of hanging and jumped the scaffold and broke his neck.

It is still a tradition to search the cellars of Westminster before royalty make their annual appearance when opening Parliament. The burning effigy that you saw on top of Tostock's bonfire is that of Guy Fawkes himself.

*" Remember, remember the fifth of November,
The gunpowder treason and plot
I know of no reason
Why the gunpowder treason
Should ever be forgot."*
